Meeting called to order by President Schnell at 5:31pm

President Schnell acknowledged a quorum was present.

Agenda approval: Motion by Motley, second by Dahlstrom. Agenda approved.

Consent agenda: Minutes of September 9, 2020 board meeting approved

Member Comment: none

Public Comment: none

Old Business: none

New Business: Motion to approve 2020/2021 budget by Baker, second by Klein. 2020/2021 budget approved.

Resolution 10-14-20 Resolution 01 to have Ron Lemcool removed as a signer at Honor Bank and Brent Schnell added to the Honor Bank checking account, offered by Klein, second by White. Passed unanimously.

Schnell made the following committee appointments: Baker, Lake Management-treatment; and White, Membership/Nominations/Social.

Due to the past president role being vacated by Lemcool as he takes on his position with Long Lake Township, Watson made the motion for Rick Kiehle to serve in role as past president. Second by Lishawa. Motion passed.

Motion by Cerny to approve 2021 meeting dates, second by Dahlstrom. Motion passed.

Committee Reports

Financial: Moy reported a fund balance of \$25,046.23 as of 9/30/2020.

Communication & Website: Kiehle reported the website is being updated to include new list of board members and new committee appointments. He also mentioned that a new video posted on our facebook page could be used as a fundraising tool.

Lake Management-Treatment: Schnell informed the board that he had received the 2021 contract from Clear Water Lake Management. It has the same cost per acre as the 2020 contract. He will execute the contract for 2021 since it is included in the now approved 2020-2021 budget. Preliminary information from the latest aerial lake survey indicates that 2020 milfoil treatments were very successful.

Lake Management-Studies: Klein reported that the new water sampling equipment has been ordered. In September water samples were collected from Long, Mickey

and Ruth Lakes. Results are forthcoming. A purple loosestrife removal workday was completed at the Timbers Recreation Area.

Lishawa reported that zebra mussels are being found in numerous quantities at various locations on Long Lake. There is no known treatment. This will potentially change and damage the ecology of Long Lake. Members are asked to contact Lishawa if zebra mussels are found.

Swimmer's Itch: no report

Lake Management-Prevention: Schnell thanked Cerny for organizing and doing road clean up.

Water Safety: Dahlstrom brought to attention the growing problem of aggressive behavior at the boat launches. Lemcool stated that the township is discussing the possible addition of a law enforcement officer at the launch during peak times.

Fishing Quality/Loon Management: Motley reported that walleye and perch fishing are very good right now. Adult loons have left the lake. Two juveniles are still here.

Membership: Watson reported that dues reminder postcards have been mailed.

Island Maintenance: Schnell reported that island docks have been pulled and routine maintenance is continuing. Lishawa noted that the Long island outhouse is in need of repair or replacement. Loon nest platform permits need to be renewed with the DNR every year.

President Schnell thanked Ron Lemcool for his tenure as president.
